Māori and Cook Islands Bilingual Classes

This year, I am proud to announce that we now have a Māori bilingual class in the senior school with Whaea Maraea. It has been two decades since Rongomai School has been able to provide a Maori bilingual learning pathway and I feel optimistic about what this could do for our students, our staff and our Rongomai community.

In saying this, I feel very proud to announce our very first Kuki Airani bilingual unit in our Year 1 & 2 syndicate. This class is being taught by our wonderful teacher – Whaea Christina Tuara. Whaea Christina is not new to our school however, she does come to us with a strength in speaking Reo Kuki Airani fluently and has a background in teaching in punanga reo (Cook Islands early childhood centre).

Sunhats

At Rongomai School, we have a sunhat policy that requires all students and staff to wear a sunhat

in terms 1 & 4 when playing outsid, especially during our break times. All tamariki have until the end of next week to bring a sunhat to school. Students who do not wear a sunhat during breaktimes, after next week, will be sent to the canopy where they'll be protected from the scorching NZ sun. Just a reminder whanau, Rongomai caps can be purchased from our school office for \$10.

School Uniform

School Uniform is compulsory for all students and can be purchased from the school office. We've tried extremely hard to keep the uniform costs low to accommodate for all our families and especially for our larger families and single parent homes.

Footwear must be black sandals or black shoes only.

<u>Powhiri</u>

Whole School Trip

Walking Bus

Just a reminder that our Walking Bus (students who need to cross Ferguson, Preston and Dawson Roads) leaves our school at 2.40pm.

The remainder of students who walk home by themselves or get picked up after school, will be escorted to the school gates.

If any child is still waiting at the gate by 3pm, our Walking Bus duty teachers will bring them back to the school playground where they can be collected from. Please be on time whanau. School finishes at 2.45pm.
